Congressman Frank Wolf served as a Republican in the U.S. House of Representatives for 17 terms (34 years) from Virginia. He worked in a bipartisan way in Congress and was the author of the International



Religious Freedom Act as well as the legislation establishing the Iraq Study Group and the National Commission on Terrorism. Wolf currently holds the Jerry and Susie Wilson Chair in Religious Freedom at Baylor University. He is also Distinguished Senior Fellow at the 21st Century Wilberforce Initiative, which focuses on international and domestic religious liberty.

Dr. Leslie Wickman, Ph.D, is a former Lockheed corporate astronaut, rocket scientist and engineer on NASA's Hubble Space Telescope and International Space Station programs. She holds advanced degrees



from Stanford and is a research scientist in the aerospace industry, as well as a faculty member at Azusa Pacific University. Leslie is the author of *God of the Big Bang* and a strong advocate of Christians serving in the highest levels of the natural sciences. She is currently the Executive Director of the American Scientific Affiliation, a non-profit organization for Christians working in the sciences.

BONITA CHRISTIAN FORUM

What happens at a Forum event?

A Forum program lasts approximately one hour, with a 45-minute presentation by the speaker and a brief period of audience Q & A following. Whenever possible we also offer an opportunity for the speaker to personally greet the public.

Where is the Forum held?

A ministry of First Presbyterian Church, Bonita Christian Forum events are held in the First Church Sanctuary, where seating is available on the main floor and in the mezzanine (balcony). All events are open seating; certain sections of the main floor are reserved for our Level 2, 3 and 4 sponsors. Additional seating is available in our CenterPoint room (where the event is viewed via live audio/video feed).

Is handicapped seating available?

The Sanctuary main floor has designated areas reserved for guests in wheelchairs and a companion. Once those areas are full, handicapped guests will be accommodated at the back of the Sanctuary or in CenterPoint. We recommend an early arrival for Sanctuary seating. Safety concerns do not allow for handicapped seating in the Sanctuary mezzanine.

Are tickets required?

Yes! Tickets are free but limited in number to ensure we do not exceed seating capacity.

How do I get tickets?

Friends of the Forum receive tickets in advance based on their level of sponsorship; remaining tickets are distributed to the public free of charge one week before each event.

When should I arrive?

Doors open at 6:15 PM; arrive early for the best choice of seats. All events begin at 7:00 PM.

Guests are welcome to browse our BookCenter or visit with our friends from Moody Radio before and after the program.
